The City Council of the City of Knoxville, Iowa convened in special session Wednesday, July 22, 2020 at 5:00 pm. Via teleconference in a joint meeting with the Marion County Board of Supervisors. Mayor Brian Hatch presided and the following Council Members were present: Megan Suhr, John Gotta, Dylan Morse, Justin Plum and Jyl DeJong. Staffs present were City Manager Aaron Adams and Assistant City Manager Heather Ussery.

Mayor Hatch gave an update to City Council in regards to the VA Campus Project Master Planning. Mayor Hatch stated that the archeological study has taken place and there were no significant findings. The State of Iowa Historical Preservation Office has 30 days to respond to the study. At that point the project will be cleared to move forward. There was an open house held for any parties interested in buildings 27 and 28. There were two firms that expressed interest and the deadline to express interest in purchasing the buildings is August 14th. Matt Carlile with Confluence was present and stated that he's met with council members and school officials in regards to the campus. He received consistent feedback in regards to Willetts Drive becoming move of a dominant intersection, bike trail connection through the campus and interest in a sports complex of some sorts. Council Member Morse asked if the project was still on schedule and Matt Carlile stated the only thing missing at this point is the public meeting feedback component that they haven't been able to do due to current circumstances. Council Member Suhr provided feedback requesting that we keep the public informed as much as possible and provide updates as much as possible on whatever level we're able to. Mayor Hatch stated if members of the community are interested in speaking about the project to get in touch with Matt with Confluence. They can contact City Hall for contact information. The next meeting will be held after the request for proposals deadline, tentatively August 25th.

Compliance Officer, Don Croghan, reviewed the procedures covered in the Risk Assessment and Ethics policies. He presented a report covering issues from Ethics/Whistleblower Policy. There were no deviations noted. In the financial testing, Executive Director was unable to locate the voucher check registers prior to the start of the meeting from April-November of 2019, 2 pulls were in this timeframe. After the meeting concluded, the statements were located. Staff had accidentally placed the PH Registers in the middle of the Voucher Registers, causing a split in sequence. Executive Director located both of the requested items and accounted for all of the entire missing registers.

Results of the inventory certification were reviewed. The changes were consistent with the inventory deletions approved in March 2020. No deviations were noted and no action was taken.

The financial risk assessment & internal control procedures were reviewed. Motion by Brent Hanna and second by Annie Leonard with no proposed changes. All voted aye.



ORDINANCE NO. 20-09

ORDINANCE VACATING A PORTION OF A STREET LOCATED WITHIN THE
CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF KNOXVILLE, IOWA

BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Knoxville, Iowa:

SECTION 1. Purpose. The purpose of this Ordinance is to vacate a certain portion of the described street and thereby relieve the City of Knoxville, Iowa, of the responsibility for its maintenance and supervision.

SECTION 2. Facts Found. The Council of the City of Knoxville, Iowa hereby makes the following findings:

- 1) The described portion of the street is not needed for the use of the public, and, therefore, its maintenance at public expense is no longer justified.
- 2) The vacation will not deny owners of property abutting on the portion of the street reasonable access to their property.
- 3) Notice of the intended vacation, including the date on which the Council considered the vacating, was published in a paper of general circulation in the City of Knoxville and posted at the Knoxville City Hall no more than twenty (20) days nor less than four (4) days prior to the date set for the hearing.

SECTION 3. Vacation:

The East 25 feet of North Attica Rd. lying West of and adjacent to all that part of Lot 1 in East Knoxville, Iowa (otherwise known as Brown's Addition to the City of Knoxville, Iowa) lying South of the right-of-way of the C. B. & Q. R. R.;

AND

The West 16 feet of North Attica Rd. lying East of and adjacent to part of Lot 13 in Block 3 in Mathew's Addition to the City of Knoxville, Iowa, North side of Robinson Street,

described as follows: Beginning at the Southeast corner of said Lot 13, thence West 85 feet and 7 inches, thence North to the South line of the right-of-way of the C.B. & Q. R. Co., thence in a Southeasterly direction along the South line of said right-of-way to the East line of Lot 13, thence South to the place of beginning.

is hereby declared vacated.

SECTION 4. Repealer. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. Conveyance. After the closing and vacating of a portion of said street, conveyance shall be by Quit Claim Deed reserving easements for the benefit of the City of Knoxville, Iowa, for the maintenance and repair of utilities which may be lying within the above described portion of the vacated street all within the City of Knoxville, Iowa.

SECTION 6. Severability Clause. If any section, provisions or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 7. When Effective. This Ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE

'SNIFFING GLUE OR OTHER CHEMICAL SUBSTANCES'

SECTION 1. The Code of Ordinances of the City of Knoxville, Iowa is amended by adding a new Section 31 in Title 6, Chapter 3, Entitled 'Sniffing Glue or other Chemical Substances', which is hereby adopted to read as follows:

6-3-31: SNIFFING GLUE OR OTHER CHEMICAL SUBSTANCES. No person shall, for the purpose of causing a condition of intoxication, euphoria, excitement, exhilaration, stupefaction, or dulling of the senses or nervous system, smell or inhale the fumes from any glue, cement, aerosol spray, inhalers, and other solvents or chemicals having the property of releasing vapors; however, this Section shall not apply to the inhalation of any medicine or anesthesia for medical or dental purposes.

SECTION 2. REPEALER. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudicated invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 4. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This Ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 20-07

6-3-11: UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE. A person should not be under the influence or simulate being under the influence of a controlled substance in violation of the Uniform Controlled Substances Act in Public Places.

SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudicated invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 3. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This Ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 20-10

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF KNOXVILLE,
IOWA, BY AMENDING PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO THE BUILDING CODE

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KNOXVILLE, IOWA:

SECTION 1. Title 8, Chapter 3, Sections 1, 3, 5 and 6 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Knoxville, Iowa are repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof:

8-3-1: ADOPTION OF BUILDING CODE. Pursuant to the provisions of the state code, the International Building Code, 2018 edition, the International Residential Code, 2018 edition and the International Existing Building Code, 2018 edition, and all amendments thereto as published by the International Code Council, is hereby adopted by reference by the city as its building code, except for such portions as may hereinafter be deleted, modified or amended. A copy of the building code is on file in the office of the city clerk. (Ord. 14-01, 3-3-2014)

8-3-3: AMENDMENTS TO THE BUILDING CODE. The International Building Code, 2018 edition (hereinafter known as the IBC), and the International Residential Code, 2018 edition (hereinafter known as the IRC); and the International Existing Building Code, 2018 edition (hereinafter known as the IEBC) are amended as hereinafter set out in Section 8-3-3:

- A. Building permit fees shall be established by city council resolution.
- B. Section R311.7.5.1, Riser height, of the IRC, is hereby amended by adding the following exceptions:
 - Section R311.7.5.1 Riser height exception 3 The maximum riser height shall be 7 ¾ inches. The riser height shall be measured vertically between leading edges of the adjacent treads. The greatest riser height within any flight of stairs shall not exceed the smallest by more than 3/8 inch , except at the top or bottom riser of any interior stair where this dimension may deviate by a maximum of 1 inch. In no case shall the risers exceed the maximum height of 7 ¾ inches.
- C. Section R311.7.8.2, Continuity, of the IRC, is hereby amended by adding the following exception:
 - Section R311.7.8.2 Continuity exception 3 Handrails within a dwelling unit or serving an individual dwelling unit shall be permitted to be interrupted at one location in a straight stair when the rail terminates into a wall or ledge and is offset and immediately continues.

D. Section R310.2.2 of the IRC, is hereby amended by adding the following exception:

Section R310.2.2 exception A landing may be provided to meet the maximum sill height of forty-four (44) inches above the floor or landing provided. The landing shall be not less than thirty-six (36) inches wide, not less than twelve (12) inches out from the exterior wall, and not more than twenty-four (24) inches in height. The landing shall be permanently affixed to the floor below or the wall under the window it serves

E. Section R313.1 Townhouse automatic fire sprinkler system, of the IRC, is hereby amended by adding the following exceptions:

1. Existing exception 1 remains unchanged.
2. An automatic residential fire sprinkler system shall not be required where additions or alterations are made to existing townhouses that do not have an automatic residential fire sprinkler system installed.
3. Townhouse structures that contain eight (8) or less dwelling units.
2. Townhouse structures less than eighteen thousand (18,000) square feet floor space, exclusive of any garages

F. Section R313.2 One-and two-family automatic fire sprinkler systems, of the IRC, is hereby amended by adding the following exception:

2. Dwelling units in which the gross square footage of the dwelling space(s), including all floor levels whether finished or unfinished and all basement areas whether finished or unfinished (exclusive of attached garage area), does not exceed 8,000 square feet.

8-3-5: MODULAR OR SECTIONAL HOMES. Modular or sectional homes shall not be deemed mobile homes, but must comply with the International Residential Code. (Ord. 14-01, 3-3-2014)

8-3-6: CONFLICT WITH STATE LAWS. Nothing in this chapter or in the International Building Code, the International Residential Code, and the International Existing Building Code, as adopted, shall be construed to be in conflict with state laws of the state housing code. In the event of such conflict, the state law shall prevail. (Ord. 14-01, 3-3-2014)

SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudicated invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 3. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This Ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

Highlights/ Significant Changes to City of Knoxville Construction Codes

The City of Knoxville along with most cities across the country adopt building codes produced by the International Code Council. The International Code Council produces codes through a governmental consensus process. The codes are developed by building safety experts worldwide and voted on by public safety officials.

Building Code

- Adopts the 2018 version of the International Building Code, International Residential Code and International Existing Building Code
 - **International Building Code** applies to commercial buildings
 - **International Residential Code** applies to 1 and 2 dwellings and townhouses
 - **International Existing Building Code** applies to renovations and alterations to existing buildings
- Highlights
 - Storm shelters are required for schools, fire stations, police stations, and other emergency operation centers. (IBC)
 - Carbon monoxide detection is required in homes (IRC)
 - Deck construction requirements now included for homes (IRC)
 - Allows for greater flexibility to reuse existing buildings with the adoption of the International Existing Building Code
- Amendments
 - International Residential Code has the following amendments
 - Riser heights of stairs are allowed greater variation at the top and bottom for differing flooring materials
 - Additional exception is allowed for handrails in homes
 - Allowance for a landing where basement egress windows might not meet the maximum sill height of 44 inches

- Modifies the fire sprinkler requirements for single family homes to only require fire sprinklers in very large homes or townhome structures.

Fire Code

- Adopts the 2018 version of the International Fire Code
 - **International Fire Code** applies to all structures and facilities within the jurisdiction to establish the minimum requirements consistent with nationally recognized good practice for providing a reasonable level of life safety and property protection from the hazards of fire, explosion or dangerous conditions in new and existing buildings, structures and premises, and to provide a reasonable level of safety to fire fighters and emergency responders during emergency operations.
- Amendments
 - Adopt appendices B,C,D, I and K
 - Appendices B, C, and D provide minimum design criteria for fire department site access. This would be beneficial for new construction sites or new subdivisions to provide the requirements for fire truck access points, road width, etc.
 - Appendix I provides a list of conditions for maintenance of existing buildings and what would be considered a hazardous situation
 - Appendix K is a supplement to the International Building Code for ambulatory care facilities (clinics that provide outpatient service, etc.)

Electrical Code

- Adopts the 2017 National Electrical Code in alliance with the State of Iowa.
- The State of Iowa has established a minimum electrical code, which is currently the 2017 National Electrical Code.
- State of Iowa also requires licensed electricians for anyone performing electrical work

Plumbing and Mechanical Code

- Adopts the State Plumbing Code and State Mechanical Code as the minimum standard for all plumbing and mechanical work
- In 2007, the State of Iowa adopted minimum standards for plumbing and mechanical work that is conducted within the State of Iowa.
- This section also references the State law requiring all who perform plumbing and/ or mechanical work to hold an appropriate State plumbing and/ or mechanical license.

ORDINANCE NO. 20-11

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF KNOXVILLE, IOWA, BY AMENDING PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO PLUMBING AND MECHANICAL CODE

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KNOXVILLE, IOWA:

SECTION 1. Title 8, Chapter 4, Section 1 is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof:

8-4-1: ADOPTION OF STATE PLUMBING CODE AND MECHANICAL CODE. The following codes are hereby adopted by reference and shall be the plumbing and mechanical code for the city:

- a) The State Plumbing Code, which consists of Sections 101 and 102 and Chapters 2 to 17 of the 2018 edition of the Uniform Plumbing Code, published by the International Association of Plumbing and Mechanical Officials, 4755 E. Philadelphia Street, Ontario, CA 91761, with amendments, as provided in 641 Iowa Administrative code, Chapter 25, and the 2018 edition of the National Fuel Gas Code ("NFPA 54") published by the National Fire Protection Association, 1 Batterymarch Park, Quincy, MA 02169-7471, and the 2017 edition of the Liquefied Petroleum Gas Code ("NFPA 58") published by the National Fire Protection Association, 1 Batterymarch Park, Quincy, MA 02169-7471, as provided in 661 Iowa Administrative Code, Chapter 226, are adopted and incorporated by this reference in their entirety as though set forth in this article, except as otherwise indicated in this article. This adoption of the State Plumbing Code is pursuant to Iowa Code Section 105.4.
- b) The State Mechanical Code which, consists of the 2018 edition of the International Mechanical Code, published by the International Code Council, 4051 West Flosmoor Road, Country Club Hills, IL 60478 ("IMC"), with amendments, as provided in 641 Iowa Administrative Code 61.2(105), is adopted and incorporated by this reference in its entirety, as though set forth in this article, except as otherwise indicated in this article. This adoption of the State Mechanical Code is pursuant to Iowa Code Section 105.4.

SECTION 2. The Code of Ordinances of the City of Knoxville, Iowa are amended by adding additional language in Title 8, Chapter 4, Sections 4, 5, 7, 8, 10, 11, 12, 14, 18, 19 and 20 which is hereby adopted to read as follows:

8-4-4: PERMIT REQUIRED. In Paragraph A line 2 – Add the words or mechanical system after the word plumbing and 8-4-6 after the word section.

In Paragraph B line 1 – Add the words and/or mechanical after the word plumbing. Lines 2 & 3 – Add the words or mechanical after the word plumbing.

8-4-5: APPLICATION. Line 3 – Add the words or mechanical after both of the words plumbing.

8-4-7: ISSUANCE OF PERMITS. Line 1 – Add 8-4-5 after the word section.

8-4-8: SUPERVISION BY GENERAL INSPECTOR. Line 1 – Add the words and/or mechanical after the word plumbing. Line 2 – Add the words and mechanical systems after the word plumbing.

8-4-10: ADDITIONAL FIXTURES. Line 1 – Add the words or mechanical after the word plumbing. Line 2 – Add the words or equipment after the word fixtures. Line 3 – Add the word equipment after the word work.

8-4-11: INSPECTION. In Paragraph A line 3 – Add 8-4-12 after the word section.

8-4-12: TESTS. Add a new second Paragraph as follows:
Natural gas piping natural gas piping test pressures shall be tested at a minimum of 10 pounds per square inch (psi) for threaded piping and corrugated stainless steel tubing (CSST) piping. Welded gas piping shall be tested at 60 psi. The test duration for a 10 psi test shall be no less than 15 minutes and the test duration for 60 psi test shall be no less than 30 minutes (Ord. 14-02, 3-3-2014)

8-4-14: FINAL ACCEPTANCE. Line 3 – Add the words or mechanical after the word plumbing.

8-4-18: ACCESS TO BUILDINGS. Line 2 – Add the word safety, after the word to.

8-4-19: NOTIFY GENERAL INSPECTOR. Line 1 – Add the words or mechanical work after the word plumbing. Line 2 – Add 8-4-12 after the word sections and 8-4-14 after the word and. Line 5 – Change the word plumber to person .

8-4-20: PLUMBING CODE PERMIT FEES. Add AND MECHANICAL to the Section title after the word PLUMBING. Line 2 – Add the words and mechanical after the word plumbing in line 1.

SECTION 3. The Code of Ordinances of the City of Knoxville, Iowa are amended by adding a new Section 21, entitled PLUMBING AND MECHANICAL CONTRACTOR

LICENSES and a new Section 22, entitled MASTER, JOURNEYMAN AND APPRENTICE LICENSE REQUIRED which is hereby adopted to read as follows:

8-4-21: PLUMBING AND MECHANICAL CONTRACTOR LICENSES. Only those individuals or business entities holding a mechanical or plumbing contractor license issued by the Iowa plumbing and mechanical systems licensing board may apply for and obtain permits to conduct mechanical and plumbing work in the City of Knoxville.

8-4-22: MASTER, JOURNEYMAN AND APPRENTICE LICENSE REQUIRED. A person shall not install or repair plumbing, HVAC, refrigeration, or hydronic systems without first obtaining a license issued by the State of Iowa for the applicable trade or discipline, or install or repair mechanical gas piping systems without first obtaining a valid certification approved by the Iowa plumbing and mechanical systems examining board. Those persons working in the mechanical and plumbing trades or disciplines who have been issued a license by the Iowa plumbing and mechanical systems examining board pursuant to Iowa Code chapter 105, shall be recognized as licensed and eligible to work in the city within the scope of activities authorized by such licenses.

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudicated invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 5. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This Ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 20-12

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF KNOXVILLE,
IOWA, BY AMENDING PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO ELECTRICAL CODE

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KNOXVILLE, IOWA:

SECTION 1. The Code of Ordinances of the City of Knoxville, Iowa is amended by repealing Title 8, Chapter 5, Section 1 and the following adopted in lieu thereof:

8-5-1: ADOPTION OF ELECTRICAL CODE. The National Electrical Code, 2017 edition, and all amendments thereto as published by the National Fire Protection Association, is hereby adopted by reference by the city as its electrical code. All electrical work shall be performed in accordance with provisions of this code except for work exempted or portions deleted, modified or amended by this chapter. A copy of the electrical code is on file in the office of the city clerk. (Ord. 09-08, 4-20-2009)

SECTION 2. The Code of Ordinances of the City of Knoxville, Iowa are amended by adding additional language in Title 8, Chapter 5, Sections 9 and 13 which is hereby adopted to read as follows:

8-5-9: APPLICATION FOR PERMIT. In line 7 – Add 8-5-12 after the word section.

8-5-13: INSPECTIONS. In Paragraph D, line 5 – Add 8-5-12 after the word Section.

SECTION 3. The Code of Ordinances of the City of Knoxville, Iowa is amended by adding a new Section 20, entitled CONFLICT WITH STATE LAWS which is hereby adopted to read as follows:

8-5-20: CONFLICT WITH STATE LAWS. Nothing in this chapter or in the National Electrical Code, as adopted, shall be construed to be in conflict with state laws or the state electrical code. In the event of such conflict, the state law shall prevail.

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudicated invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 5. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This Ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
